

Benefits/Help if you are a Carer

This contains general information to give you an overview. For more specific queries please contact the relevant benefits department or your local Council.



Carers Allowance

Carer's allowance is a benefit paid to people who give regular care to someone who is ill or disabled.

You could get £69.70 a week if you care for someone at least 35 hours a week and they get certain benefits.

You may be eligible if:

You're not working or studying for 21 hours a week or more Your earnings are £132 or less a week after tax, National Insurance and expenses

Note:

You do not have to be related to, or live with, the person you care for.

You can apply for Carers Allowance online on the GOV.uk site or you can print the form off and complete it by hand.

Carer Element/Universal Credit

Universal Credit is a benefit paid to people who are not in work. It is a means tested, earnings replacement benefit.

The Carer Element under Universal Credit is £168.81 and this is paid as part of your monthly amount.

By satisfying the 'Carer Test' (if you care for someone at least 35 hours a week and they get certain benefits and are deemed severely disabled) the Carer Element added onto your Universal Credit could mean that you are exempt from job seeking requirements.

Note:

A person could claim Universal Credit (Carer Element) at the same time as Carers Allowance but please note that Carers Allowance will be deducted from their Universal Credit.

Universal Credit is usually applied for online or in certain circumstances over the phone.

Carer Premium

The Carer Premium is an extra amount added to certain benefits if you are caring for someone.

To get the Carer Premium, you need to be claiming a certain benefit and provide a certain level of unpaid care. You need to be claiming at least one of these benefits:

Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA) Income Support Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance Housing Benefit Pension Credit.

The Carer Premium is £38.85 a week.

Note:

A Carer Premium could also be helpful in a claim for Council Tax Reduction – contact your local council for information.

If you qualify, the Carer Premium will usually be added to your benefit automatically. If this has not happened, you can contact the department for the benefit you are already claiming to tell them that you're a carer.

As the Hospice predominantly supports families in Hackney, Tower Hamlets and Newham, we have included specific information about support available in these boroughs but please contact your local Council to ask for more information if you live outside these areas.

Hackney

Hackney Carer's Card

Carers aged 18 or over who provide care for a Hackney resident, of any age, can apply for a Hackney carer's card. Carers will be able to receive discounts on goods in some Hackney retailers and also leisure centres and alternative therapists. When applying for a CEA Card, the person you care for must be receiving either:

- Disability Living Allowance (DLA)
- Attendance Allowance (AA)
- Personal Independence Payments (PIP) or
- Armed Forces Independence Payment (AFIP).
